

Four of Utah's foremost string players showcase their talents as Aldiviva Quartet members. Utah Symphony violinist, John Thompson; Utah Symphony bassist, Patrick Zwick; guitarist/composer Tully Cathey; and classical guitarist, Todd Woodbury make up this one of a kind ensemble.

The name Aldiviva was coined from Vivalidi by the 17th centry Italian composer, Benedetto Marcello, in mocking Vivaldi's non-traditional use of the mandolin. Like the flip-flop syllables, Aldiviva performs both ways: as a traditional mandolin quartet and as a quartet featuring violin, guitar and mandolins.

In concert, the Quartet performs works by Vivaldi and other great composers from the Renaissance, Baroque and Classical periods, as well as compositions by modern composers, including Aldiviva's Tully Cathey.

Tully Cathey is an avid composer, whose works have been performed by regional symphonies. His composition "Elements" was recently performed by nationally acclaimed Windham Hill's Modern Mandolin Quartet. Mr. Cathey has also scored several documentaries which have aired over PBS.

## THE FIRST NIGHT STORY

It started almost twenty years ago in Boston, with a private group of individuals who were ignited by the idea of a communal celebration of the New Year. They put their faith in the power of the arts, to inspire, to educate and to entertain. And because the arts transcend boundaries of race, age, gender, language and social status, First Night founders hoped the arts could bring both neighborhood and suburban communities of Boston together in a shared celebration.

While there were many believers in the very first First Night, there were also plenty of skeptics. Suburbanites worried about safety after dark, sponsors worried about winter weather, some worried about rowdy behavior while other worried no one would even come downtown on New Year's Eve.

As it turned out, 60,000 people would come down town that New Year's Eve. Over the years, the Boston's skeptics have seen First Night build community spirit and nurture the arts; essential elements of any city's well being. In fact, across North America civic leaders are so encouraged by Boston's

experience with peaceful, festive crowds, they now run First Night celebrations in over 100 cities.

From Boston to Calgary to Honolulu to our own Salt Lake City, First Night celebrations will bring out the best: a drawing together of diverse crowds in the best mood, after dark in downtown areas, reaffirming a community spirit through the



celebration of the best in the arts.
